special exhibition private collecting

The state of Baden-Württemberg has a rich cultural landscape of private art collections. We want to present a unique and contemporary perspective on these collections by asking young curators to pose current questions about the collected works of art. We present the eye-opening and horizon-broadening results of this inquiry in the special exhibition "Private Collecting" in Hall 3. This year, the director of the Städtische Galerie Karlsruhe, Stefanie Patruno, will present her view, her questions and her exhibition.

paper:square

The paper:square is an open, loosely grouped exhibition of artistic works created with, from and through paper. The selected galleries and their artists highlight the medium of paper in all its many facets and offer visitors an overview of the diversity of the medium. A meeting place for young collectors, a space for newcomers and aficionados of this special artistic material.

academy:square

The future needs young talent. This curated presentation of works by promising graduates from art colleges in Baden-Württemberg aims to support these young artists as they enter the art market. Together with LBBW and Monopol, we want to heighten the visibility of these talented young people by enabling exhibitors and collectors to discover hitherto unseen artistic positions..

forum:karlsruhe

Karlsruhe's cultural institutions will present themselves at forum:karlsruhe. In addition to the focus on UNESCO City of Media Arts and on media art, special presentations by the Zentrum für Kunst und Medientechnologie ZKM | Center for Art and Media, the Kunstakademie Karlsruhe (Karlsruhe Art Academy) and the Staatliche Kunsthalle Karlsruhe (Karlsruhe State Art Gallery) will make these institutions' current topics and projects directly tangible.





sculpture:square

Large-scale sculptures are an integral part of art karlsruhe. In the halls, the 100-square-metre spaces with their threedimensional works, shaped by the individual signatures of the artists, create a sense of rhythm throughout the tour and enhance the visitors' experience. This year, we are awarding the Loth Sculpture Prize for the seventh time together with our partner L-Bank. Thanks to support from the Vollack Group, we are presenting numerous large-scale sculptures in the sculpture garden at the trade fair centre. With the sculpture spots in the circulation areas and foyer, our exhibitors welcome visitors the moment they set foot in the entrance area and put them in the mood for an eventful tour.

re:discover

Together with the Bundesverband Deutscher Galerien und Kunsthändler e.V. (BVDG) and supported by the Beauftragte der Bundesregierung für Kultur und Medien (BKM), we would like to make artists visible again, who have not yet received their due attention in the art market. With this funding, we especially want to give more space to the current and art-historical significance of female artists. You can look forward to exciting discoveries and learn more about the individual positions and their backgrounds at the ARTIMA art meeting on 20 and 21 February.

re:frame

Our grappling with the topic of rediscovery has once again shown us that there is a great need to talk about estates and deceased artists who have left significant bodies of work behind. How do heirs, administrators and galleries deal with these legacies? How do best-practice examples look? Exemplary artworks from estates will be presented at various stands at art karlsruhe under the label "re:frame". In addition, we invite you to discuss and deepen your appreciation of this topic at the ARTIMA art meeting.
